Use the button on the Flight One webpage under the Online Learning Centre tag:



In the top right corner click on "login"

Your username and password will be sent to you in a separate email, or is available in-store. If it prompts you to change your password on initial login, please do. The password will need letters of both cases, a number and a punctuation character.

Please keep your password secure as this will be needed for security of the system as well as keeping track of your results. (It would be quite disappointing to find you have failed a subject because someone else was playing around in your login.)





The menu bar on the left hand side has a few items but you will mainly be interested in “My Courses” to get you started.



Clicking on “My Courses” opens up the drop down menu that will show you the courses you are enrolled in – in this case, Joe Bloggs is only enrolled in the GFPT course.

Once you click on the GFPT link there, your world of education will open up.



You will be able to see all the resources you need to pass a course and many more. Just start at the top and, at your own pace, and in your own time, progress through each lesson. We will expect, however, that you do come prepared for your lessons so, for example, if you are booked to fly the “Straight and

Level” lesson we will assume you have completed the “Straight and Level” lesson here as well as any associated activities like quizzes, watching videos or reading articles.

Let us lead you through the beginnings of the GFPT course.

The first section is to get you started. These documents....

....are what you will need to get started on your way so get them filled in and make sure everything is correct according to the instructions. Then make an appointment to get all the witness and other signatures done at Flight One so we can get the paperwork rolling. It can take up to 4 (or more) weeks to process and we don't want to delay your training by not having the paperwork and licences properly processed.

There are a few other forms there that you will need later on but we will concentrate on the documents you need to get started.

The Day VFR Syllabus is the CASA (Civil Aviation Safety Authority – our regulator) syllabus we (and all flying schools) must abide by. Your instructor can guide you through it if you wish but it will allow you to take control of you own education and development and is a great guide for study.

The Flight One GFPT book shows you how you will progress through our system to achieve all that is required. This will allow you to see what is coming up in your next lessons and prepare for them.

The VFR Flight Guide is a great resource put out by CASA and can be used as a text book for many of the subjects you will be studying.

The PHAK is an American publication that is free on the web through the FAA (the American version of our CASA) and it is a fantastic textbook. It has many sections and you will find some are not available here as they will give you incorrect information for this country – for example law, meteorology and navigation all have differences from Australia.

We then get into the course proper.


